Creative Outsiders Meet Europe


What could be more creative than being different?¹

Now, the time has COME. The growing network of European Outsider Art Association (EOAA), discussions and knowledge sharing in the EOAA interest groups, several crisscroosing collaborations in the association and the joint work on the EOAA annual international conference have laid the foundation for a two year long project on the unique expressions and creative capabilities of outsider artists across Europe: Creative Outsiders Meet Europe (COME).

The idea and the aim are simple: we will join forces to create a breakthrough in the awareness and recognition of outsider artist in the cultural field as well as in the general European public.

COME: Creative Spaces and Collections of Creativity

COME is a two year long European collaborative project between EOAA members. COME will raise awareness to thecreative world of outsider artists and their environments as well as outsider art collections. This is done by:



- Generating a model of travelling exhibition and network of curators
- Internatinal exhibitions in European contries
- Conferences (Palermo, Sicily, spring 2015 Katowice, Polen 2016)
- Symposium in Mänttä, Finland 2015 autumn

INTEREST GROUP MEETING

Directed by Raija Kallioinen and Marina Giordano, EOA board members

The group had its first meeting in Heidelberg in May 2013, and the second meeting in Paris in October 2013. In the third meeting in Paris, May 15th 2014, the topics were these:

Raija Kallioinen introduced the idea of EOA's project application to *Creative Europe* programme by EU. In the project "COME" the environments will be in focus in year 2015. There will be an international conference in Palermo, Italy, in June, arranged by Osservatorio Outsider Art, and a smaller meeting in Mänttä, Finland, in September, arranged by Union for Rural Culture. As well the project will produce an Internet-based map for sharing information of OA sites, museums and studios for promoting them. If EOA will fail to get the financing to the project, the conferences will be arranged anyhow, but in a smaller scale.

Marina Giordano presented the idea for the EOA's international conference in Palermo. The dates will be around June 20th, 2015. The main theme will be a question *how to protect OA environments as European cultural heritage*. The aim will be to produce a *European Charter* of good practices and recommendations

for saving the sites. Besides the conference there will be arranged and excursion to some Sicilian OA sites. Osservatorio Outsider Art O.O.A. (directed by Eva di Stefano) will plan the conference program. They are willing to hear proposals for contents and lecturers from all of us. **Please write your suggestions and proposals to Marina Giordano**, marinagiord@gmail.com.

Laurent Danchin gave a richly illustrated presentation on varying French sites, showing examples on sites which are in danger to be destroyed, as well as those which have been saved with careful protecting and successful conserving. Laurent Danchin also arranged an excursion to Chomo's site on Saturday June 17th.

Jo Farb Hernandez told about work of SPACES in USA, and also her research of Spanish OA environments and her new book Singular Spaces. Database used on SPACE's website would be useful to study when planning the European web-based map: http://spacesarchives.org/about/.

Proposals for the conference in Palermo:

The main topic of the interest group meeting was sharing proposals, what viewpoints should be included to the next conference in Palermo. The group gave these suggestions:

Not only academic discussion, but also practice of protecting. Workshop on restoration of the sites.

Social aspects of restoration the sites. Relationship with community around.

Second life of the site after creator's death.

Outsider Art sites as intangible heritage. Narrative dimensions. Importance of stories. Links to the lives of the creators.

Sustainable use of the sites. How to treat tourism?

Affecting to authorities and politicians. Examples from different countries. Similarities and differences.

How to finance protecting: funding by state and authorities, sponsors, crowdsourcing, EU support, voluntaries...

Importance of personal experience, visiting the sites, getting to know people who organize reservation and voluntary work, sharing good practices.

ROUND-TABLE DISCUSSION "INHABITANT LANDSCAPER"

The initiative by Roberta Trapani and Paola Capone was to open a conversation between experts of Outsider Art environments and academic researchers around the concept "Inhabitant Landscaper", created by Bernand Lassus (http://www.bernard-lassus.com/).
